2 The point P lies on the curve with equation $y = \frac{3x}{2x-1}$ with x coordinate 1.

Find an equation to the tangent to the curve at the point P .

3 The point P lies on the curve with equation $y = \frac{e^x+1}{e^x+3}$ with x coordinate 0.

Find an equation to the normal to the curve at the point P .

4 Find the coordinates of the stationary points of the curve $y = \frac{x}{9+x^2}$ and determine the nature of the stationary points.
